RULES

- 1 The Show shall be divided into twelve divisions:
Div. 1,2,5,6,7,8,9, - Open to all, place of residence of no account.
Div.3 - Open to all residents of Stutton (excluding those who are professional or Market Gardeners) who do not employ regular or part-time Kitchen Gardeners
Div.4 - Open to all persons already exhibiting five or more items in
Div. 1 or 2 or 3.
Div.10 - Open to all children between 8 and 11 years as at Show date.
Div.11 - Open to all children between 5 and 7 years as at Show date.
Div.12 - Open to all children 4 years and under as at Show date.
- 2 The Committee reserves the right of verifying exhibits in case of need.
If this rule is violated, all prizes and entry fees shall be forfeited and the Committee may refuse the competitor any further entry to the show.
- 3 The Committee has the power to inspect the garden or allotment of any exhibitor at any time during the week of the show and may refuse entry.
- 4 **All entry forms shall be signed and handed to Mrs Sarah Cooper by 8.00 p.m. on the Wednesday prior to the show. No entries will be accepted after that time.**
- 5 **Exhibits shall be staged between 8.00a.m. - 10.00a.m. on the day of the Show. Exhibitors will be required to leave the Hall at 10a.m. promptly**
- 6 No Exhibitor shall enter more than one exhibit in each class.
- 7 The Judges' decision shall be final.
- 8 The Judges may withhold any prize if they consider the specimen not deserving, or if there are not sufficient entries.
- 9 Objections to an exhibit must be lodged, in writing, with the Committee before 3.30 p.m. on the day of the Show. £1 must be deposited, which will be returned if the objection is upheld.
- 10 **Entry Fees: Div. 1, 2, 3, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9: 10p per exhibit. Div. 4: 50p.
Div. 10, 11, 12: Free**
- 11 Scoring: 1st - 5 pts., 2nd - 3 pts., 3rd - 2 pts., H/Commended - 1 pt.
- 12 Prize money will be: 1st = 50p, 2nd = 30p, 3rd = 20p, HC = 10p.
Classes 47, 48, 49, 73 & 74: Prize money will be
1st = 60p, 2nd = 40p, 3rd = 20p.
Division 4: Prize money will be: 1st = £3.00, 2nd = £2.00, 3rd = £1.00 .

Show Tips

DIVISION 1 - Flowers

This is not a "flower arrangement" division (see Div. 8 for those), but a pleasing display of flowers in tip top condition strictly according to the class. Pick stems as long and straight as possible and preferably condition them in a bucket of cold water the night before the show, protect from rain and wind. **Specimen** means a bloom chosen for closeness to the ideal shape, colour and condition. **Disbudded** means take off all the buds.

Specimen dahlia blooms should have no side shoots.

Check your dahlia belongs to either the *cacti* or the *decorative* type.

A bedding plant lasts for one year. It is put in a flower bed or

Cut only the lower leaves from the stems of specimen roses.

Hybrid Tea (HT) roses have a group of central petals which come to a point.

Floribunda roses means many blooms from one main stem.

A Bedding Plant usually lasts for one year only. The plant is put in a flower bed or pot before it flowers, and is then removed after flowering.

Note the size of vase where given. Use oasis, moss or scrunched newspaper to pack the stems in the vase where necessary.

For the **herb** class, use herbs NOT in flower.

DIVISIONS 2, 3, 4 and 5 - Vegetables and Fruit

Aim for blemish-free and uniform size & shape, maintaining the natural bloom.

Beans and Peas: Leave a little of the stalk showing.

Shallots: Exhibition class – turn tops over and bind with raffia.

Display on a plate or dish of sand.

Tomatoes: Leave the calyx on (green top-knot!).

Cucumber & Courgettes: Can be shown with or without the flower attached.

Potatoes & Root Vegetables: Lift potatoes 4 or 5 days beforehand to allow them to dry off before cleaning. Do not scrub, lightly clean with damp sponge.

Many vegetables you can harvest over the days before the show and keep wrapped in damp newspaper in the fridge. Spreading the harvest can help achieve a same size batch and lighten the last minute work load.

Pick up a free Show Schedule from the Community Shop, King's Head, Looking Good and the Schedule can be found on the Stutton Village web site.

Two weeks before Show date.

Entry box is out at Primrose Cottage!

On the entry form, which you find at the back of your schedule, circle the class numbers you want to put an entry into and fill in your name and address.

One person per entry form and only one exhibit per class.

Put this form with your entry money, if any (children's entries are free) into the entry box outside the address advertised on your form.

Wednesday before the Show

Entry form to be handed in by 8 pm!

The Committee needs time to process and administer all the forms. This means that **we cannot accept any entries brought in on the day of the show.**

SATURDAY SHOW DAY!

8.00 – 10.00 am Community Hall open to stage entries.

You will be handed your entry cards. Every exhibit that you have marked on your entry form has his own card and class. The tables in the hall have been divided into 147 sections and given a number corresponding with the class number on your card. Stage your item by putting your show card, face down on the table, placing your entry on top.

10.00 am Hall is cleared of participants and Judging will commence.

(Hall opens at 2.00 pm for wheelchair users and for special requests if required)

2.30 pm Gates open to Flower Show Hall and Mini Fête.

Now is the time to see how you have done. There are Best in Division awards, rosettes, cups and for those that have been awarded with a 1st, 2nd, 3rd or Highly Commended in their class, there is prize money to be won.

Around 3.45 pm you can pick up your prize money from the Treasurer, left of stage, but please leave your entries on display until after the presentation of cups and after the raffle has been drawn.

4.00 pm Presentation of cups followed by the raffle draw.

Notes & Tips

Tips for **Cookery**:

All exhibits to be on a plate or board. All items to be covered with cling film which will be provided on the day.

Victoria sponge should be free of grid marks and the sides of the tin should be straight. If made the day before, avoid jam soaking in by spreading it on just before staging. A sprinkling of caster sugar is acceptable.

Plain and fluted cutter:

Plain and savoury scones and biscuits should be cut with a plain cutter; sweet scones and biscuits should be cut with a fluted cutter.

Note for **Preserves**:

All jars, approx. 400g, should be labelled with type of preserve & date. Cellophane and waxed discs for jars without screw lids. Otherwise, screw lids must be new and waxed discs should NOT be used.

Note for **Wine Division**:

All spirit and wines to be exhibited in clear glass bottles with flanged corks. Labels to be plain white 5 x 2.5 cm and approximately 3 cm from the bottom of the bottle.
Corks can be obtained from the Show Secretary on the day of the Show.
