# **Tour of Britain hits Stutton**

On the morning of Thursday the 7th September there was an eerie hush in Stutton. No parking cones were out and traffic was minimal. Then the motorcycles started to arrive. Residents of Stutton ventured out and lined the streets. School children were excused their lessons to gather in an excited and noisy crowd. The motorcycles gave way to three cycles speeding through the village. Then nothing but motorcycles. Was that it? No, they were just a breakaway group and it wasn't until another two and a half minutes that the spectacle of the Tour of Britain peloton of another 90 cycles "whooshed" through, jostling for position on the bends by the Old Post Office to the delight and applause of the crowd.

Stutton was lucky enough to be on the route of Stage Five of the Tour of Britain, hosted by Felixstowe. The stage was won by Wout Van Aert (number 71) with three seconds later, Great Britain's Ethan Vernon (number 31) in a photo finish clinching second place. Check your photos! ### **Nature Notes**

I'm writing these nature notes during the early-September heatwave. There's no doubt that the series of climatic extremes we have been experiencing is effecting our wildlife. There are some winners, particularly species expanding their range from continental Europe, but the number of losers far outweighs those. If increasing temperatures drive species further north there is only so far they can go.

Insects are generally the first noticeable sign of change. The superbly presented Beautiful Marbled was first seen in the UK in 2001 and is now working its way north and appeared in my garden this year. And this year, I've had several people ask me about a day-flying moth they've seen which has turned out to be the strikingly marked Jersey Tiger. Certainly for the latter, give it 10 years and they will be a common occurrence here. - Mark Nowers





From the August meeting, we were asked about when the additional names were going to be added to our War Memorial and Councillor Leach reports that this will be completed shortly, weather permitting. Questions were asked about a parked car up the footpath into the new estate from Stutton Close and we may discuss placing a post in the pathway to block this. Other local information is that a consultation will be coming on Suffolk Library services, please look out for it and support your library service. Also, we have had complaints about green waste obstructing paths so please could I ask residents to ensure paths are kept free of debris, and hedges are cut well back from the edge of paths. Our village noticeboard by the telephone box has been superbly refurbished by Chris Leach and looks good for the next 20 years at least - many thanks Chris!

In planning news, we objected to an application at the Old Methodist Church owing to the height of the wall proposed (and indeed, built) and wheelie bin storage. We recommended approval to an extension and associated works at Sunnyside, Lewis lane. Now the neighbourhood plan (NP) has been fully adopted, it is being used in all planning under consideration.

The proposal from the cycle strategy group is still under consideration however with some parts meeting opposition, mainly around cyclists and pedestrians mixing on the same path. Further discussions are continuing.

Mike Hems and I will be meeting with interested parties on Friday 22nd September to discuss possible proposals for the small parcel of land to the rear of Fison Place where it has been suggested the Parish Council may take ownership, involving Stutton Grows as well. Whilst in the playing field area, I am intending on placing a combination lock on the new gate into it from Fison Place.

The Greenway is drifting a little as the County ponders the contractors and tree root issues and we await a revised quote so I have asked Mike Hems to be the lead councillor on this to keep focus. **Darren Cooper**

# The Night Sky this month



Blue supermoon!! Did you see it? My sister contacted me the next day to say that she had put her dressing gown on and gone outside to see this wondrous event. She was unimpressed to say the least as, I guess, many of you were? First of all, the term 'supermoon' is not a true scientific term, it was coined a few years ago by an astrologer. In the case of the Earth/Moon system the distance of the Moon varies by up to 10% or 40,000 km every orbit (29.5 days) As a consequence the Moon can vary in apparent diameter by up to 14% and in brightness by up to 30% between the farthest and closest appearance. When the full Moon coincides with one of the close approaches it may be called a supermoon. Because the definition is not that precise there may be up to 3 or 4 supermoons in a year.

Blue Moons, on the other hand are easier to define, the first (correct) definition of a Blue Moon comes from the Maine Farmers' Almanac that has provided long-term weather forecasts for the U.S. and Canada since 1818. According to them a Blue Moon is the third full Moon in a season that has four. Astronomical seasons are defined according to the solstices and equinoxes, so they run from winter solstice, in mid-December to mid-March and so on. Thus, they do not map onto calendar months; for example, astronomical winter includes parts of December and March as well as all of January and February. Although there are 7 Blue Moons of each sort in a 19-year period they all occur on different dates. You might like to try to work out why; on the other hand, you could just wonder at the beauty of a full Moon rising every month Mike Haynes


